### School Annual Education Report (AER)

March 7, 2017

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for the Lapeer County Education and Technology Center programs. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

One key challenge for Lapeer County Intermediate School District's (LCISD) center-based program is to collect data that allows staff to document and analyze curricular gains across our programs. Nearly all of our data collection is done at the singular student level based on individualized student goals, which address academic standards as well as independence and employability skills. All students that attend the LCISD Center Program are working toward a Certificate of Completion and not a High School Diploma. As students advance through the academic and vocational curriculum and grade levels each year, it is difficult to measure and track success in extended content standards (Common Core Essential Elements). MI-Access provides a snapshot of each student's success annually, but it doesn't give us a true picture of each student's yearly academic growth. We continue to search for universal assessments that will progress monitor and guide our school improvement plan.



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State law requires that we also report additional information.

### **1. Enrollment Process:**

The Lapeer County Intermediate School District (LCISD) provides educational programming to students with "low incidence" disabilities such as cognitive impairment, severe multiple impairment, and students with autism spectrum disorder. Students are referred to LCISD special education programs by the local districts as determined through the Individual Education Plan (IEP) process.

### 2. Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan

School Improvement efforts are focused on the improvement of proficiency in English Language Arts and employability skills.

### 3. Description of School:

The Lapeer Education and Technology Center (ETC) provides unique learning opportunities for Lapeer County students. Special Education provides classroom programs and other types of services that are designed especially for children with various types of disabilities from birth through age 26, or until graduation from high school. These include ancillary services, assistive technology, Early On, Parent Advisory Committee, Build Up Michigan, referrals and transition services.

The ETC also provides career and technical instruction for Lapeer County high school students. There are technical and academic applications in 21 different CTE programs available. Students can earn college credit in the programs.

Adult Education services are available for students age 20 and older. Students can choose one of two paths—High School Completion or GED Preparation and Testing. Community Education services provide career training and enrichment classes for adults for a fee.

### 4. Core Curriculum:

The Special Education program follows the General Education Curriculum modified by the State to align with the MI-Access assessment. Please contact the Special Education Office for more information at 810.664.5917.

### 6. Parent-Teacher Conferences:

Formal Parent-Teacher Conferences are not held due to the nature of the center-based program. However, ongoing written and phone communications do take place with parents to discuss student progress.

This is not applicable to our Special Education students as the ISD does not issue diplomas to its students. The local districts maintain this information for their high school CTE students.
